5. *Kite Runner by Khaled Hosseini

Traces the unlikely friendship of a wealthy Afghan youth and a servant's son, in a tale that spans the final days of Afghanistan's monarchy through the atrocities of the present day.

6. *A Child Called It by David Pelzer

Detailing a childhood of not only severe abuse by his mother, but apparent apathy to his plight by his father, A Child Called 'It' describes one of the most severe documented cases of child abuse in California history.

23. *Hiroshima by John Hershey

On August 6, 1945, an atomic bomb destroyed the city of **Hiroshima**, Japan. In this book, Hersey reveals what happened that day. Told through the memories of the six survivors, it is a timeless, powerful and compassionate document.

24. *Left for Dead by Peter Nelson

Recalls the sinking of the U.S.S. Indianapolis at the end of World War II, the navy cover-up and unfair court martial of the ship's captain, and how a young boy helped the survivors set the record straight fifty-five years later.

Chronicles the joys and sorrows of the four March sisters as they grow into young women in nineteenth-century New England.
